ANNUAL EGG HUNT MARCH 31 THIS YEAR

The Easter Bunny may be wearing a parka at this years Egg Hunt. Easter comes early on March 31st this year The Arnold Heights Easter Egg Hunt has been a staple for many years now. It has come early before and we don't think it ever had to be cancelled due to weather, so let's see what this year brings.

We still intend to hold the event this year and it will still be held at the old site of the

AirPark Recreation Center at 3720 NW 46th Street. The building will not be open so there will be no restrooms available.

Kids from age 10 and under who are accompanied by an adult are welcome to participate. This year's event as in past years will include candy and prizes strewn across three designated areas by age. Children should bring their own baskets or containers to collect their prizes and candy. Please remember to dress



accordingly as we never know what springtime weather in Nebraska may bring.

Please be sure to arrive early as the Egg Hunt will begin promptly at 9:00 AM with the 0 -3 year old age group. Hop on down to the old Rec Center site on March 31st.

POWER THE FUTURE: HEAT PUMP EVENT

Take action to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in your home by replacing your aging air conditioner and furnace with an air source heat pump! Get the facts about heat pumps at an educational event sponsored by local environmental organizations on Saturday, February 3rd, 10 - 11:30 a.m. at the Unitarian Church of Lincoln, 6300 A Street. Resilient Electric Analytics es-

timates that the average cost difference between installing a traditional AC/gas furnace or an air source heat pump in a 2,400 square foot home in Lincoln is \$1,700, and using a heat pump will reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 43 tons over

its lifetime. The City of Lincoln and LES are offering a combo rebate of \$1,800 with the purchase of a 15.2 SEER2 air source heat pump, so now is Electric System Manager of a good time to install one in your home.

Speakers at the event will explain the basics of how a heat pump works, why it is important not to wait until your unit is broken to replace it, economic costs and environmental benefits of air source heat pumps, and rebates and tax credits available for installing heat pumps. Speakers include City Council Representative Bennie Shobe, former City Council Representative and State Senator Ken Haar, former

City Council Representative Curt Donaldson, Lincoln's Chief Sustainability Officer Kim Morrow, and Lincoln **Energy Services Marc** Shkolnick.


Down the Library Aisle

Head Start now enrolling for fall

Community Action Head Start and Early Head Start are currently enrolling children age 0-5 for the fall term, which begins August 2024. Head Start is a FREE early childhood education program, which partners with children,

families, and the community to build the skills children need to be successful in school and in life. Head Start's comprehensive program serves the whole family. Families with low income or receiving SNAP, SSI, or ADC are eligible for Head Start or Early Head Start.

Early Head Start is available for families from pregnancy through age 3 offers either in-home or center-based learning options. The home-based program provides opportunities for education from home as well as monthly socialization activities with other families. There are three Head Start centers in Lincoln, located at 18th & K, 26th & N, and 23rd & O. Head Start is a year-round, full-day program.

Resources for you at the Family Resource Center

Friends with Food:

Free food distribution on the fourth Monday of the month from 5-6 p.m. It is a commodities distribution and families must qualify for this distribution. *This institution is an equal opportunity provider*.

Computer Center:

Free internet access, and printers. Children under 18 must be accompanied by an adult. Open Monday-Friday, 8am-12pm and 1-5pm.

Clothing Closet:

Free clothing, toys and other items are available. The room is open from 8am-noon and 1-5 pm, Monday through Friday. No appointment is necessary but you will need to sign-in at the front desk.

Book Swap Room:

Free books available during the following times: M– F, 8am-12pm and 1-5pm.

Low-Income Bus Passes:

Thirty-one day bus passes may be purchased at the Resource Center for \$8.00. ID, and date of birth are required. Hours for purchasing passes are M-F, 8am-12pm and 1-5pm.

Senior Coffee Club:

Meets weekly on Wednesdays from 9-10:30 a.m. at the FRC. All seniors 55+ are welcome to come for coffee, conversation and speakers.
